Another huge "Thank You" from Peterborough Lions Club to everyone who took part in this year's quiz! Money is still coming in from the wonderful people who helped sell our quiz sheet but we've already raised over £4,000 for great causes with your help. Thanks also to my team for helping me put together the latest brainteaser and diligently marking the hundreds of answer sheets we had returned to us.

This was my first year in the late Lion John Cheetham's shoes – huge shoes that my feet struggled to fill. Many people will have known Lion John through this quiz but his work in the local community, both within Lions and beyond, was incredibly broad and wide reaching. He was indeed a true local hero, and if you check out the first letter of each official answer you'll find we hid a tribute to him in this, the first quiz since he left us. We hope we've done justice to the institution he created.

And so to those answers. There was no one question which tripped most people up; several puzzlers share that honour, and not always the ones we expected. We thought Q69: "The Kray Twins" (3,5) would be the biggest challenge (the answer, Tom Hardy, played both of the identical twins in the 2015 film "Legend"), but the majority of sheets returned to us had that answer, with a few opting for "The Kemps" which we also accepted.

The question which generated the biggest variety of answers was Q17: "911 canine hero" (5 letters). Our answer, Trakr, turned out to be only one of many of the dogs that helped in the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks. The most common answer was Daisy; a dog which never actually existed and is the creation of an Internet hoax, but having set the "but are they all real?" tagline for the guiz we decided in the end to allow it.

As usual, a quiz intended to test your knowledge ended up challenging ours. Well done to the many who spotted our "deliberate" error in Q15: "29 Acacia Avenue"; we did indeed mean "29 Acacia Road" where Bananaman lived. We'd never heard of the "Robinsons" of 29 Acacia Avenue, but obviously accepted both. (Received answers were fairly evenly split between the two, if you were curious.)

My two personal favourite correct alternative answers were Namgyal Wangdi for Q46 (Hillary's Helper), which was Tenzing Norgay's birthname, and Leelee Sobieski as the American actress who played "Joan of Arc" (Q49), albeit less famously than Ingrid Bergman with only two people giving that answer. Honourable mention for "Kyle", the surname of Catwoman and an equally valid answer to Q74: "Eartha Kitt?" as our own "Yzma".

We caught a few people out with Q81: "One of us, regal" (Lion King) – I'm not sure what those saying "King Kong" were suggesting? And whilst nobody got Harry Potter wrong (Q2: "Hogwarts Finest") a lot of people didn't unscramble Q93's anagram "Need storm?" to find the villains from the same books (Dementors).

So, how did you do? Were you one of only 14 clever clogs with all answers correct? If not, which questions tripped you up? We hope it was enjoyable either way and that you'll be back again next year to exercise your brain cells in the run up to Christmas and support great causes like this year's public access defibrillators project.

As Lions, we are part of Lions Clubs International, the world's largest service organisation. We are all unpaid volunteers giving a little of our time back to our communities; every penny we make from selling quiz sheets and other activities goes to good use (all our admin costs are covered by club members). It genuinely does make it worthwhile when people come looking for the quiz every year, or come to talk to us about projects we've been involved with in the past or might be in the future.

If you do have a little spare time and would be interested in putting it to good use, then please drop us a line. If you're not local to us – this quiz goes far and wide – then we'll put you in contact with a local club if we can. Of-course volunteering is, rather obviously, voluntary, and if like most people you don't have the time free or are already involved with other organisations then please do continue to come and say hello when you see us shivering outside a supermarket. Even the little things such as "liking" and "following" us on Facebook help us to get our messages out there, and will let us remind you that you can buy our quiz sheets online via our website when the next one is released in a few months time.
